Names of people, animals, places or things are called **naming words**.

### Countable and uncountable naming words

You can count *woman* and *child*. If they are more than one, we say:  
women, children

You can count *pancake*, *pan*, *wheel*, *road*.

How many pancakes are there on the plate?

How many pans are there in the kitchen?

How many wheels does a bicycle have?

How many roads are there in this town?

We can give a number to answer these questions.

These are called **countable naming words**, because these naming words can be counted.

Can we say, 'How many milks are there in this cup?' No, we cannot.

We say, 'How much milk is there in this cup?' A little milk, some milk.

Such naming words which we cannot count are called **uncountable naming words**.

We cannot say *three waters*, *two milks*, *seven sugars* or *five rices*. Uncountable naming words do not have plural forms.

But we can say *a glass of water* or *two bags of rice*. This is because glass and bag can be counted.
